

PREPARING FOR AN INTERVIEW

Preparing for a job interview might feel daunting but with a bit of preparation it needn't be. Companies want you to do well and love it when you are prepared, knowledgeable and show a real interest in them. So follow these top tips to give yourself the best chance of getting the next job offer and rid yourself of those unwanted interview jitters.

- 1. Research the company. It might sound obvious, but do your homework about the company you are interviewing with. Go to their website, Linkedin page or other social media platforms. Make a note of any particular projects or elements of their business that interest you. If you use a recruiter, they will be able to assist you in finding out about the company and giving helpful insights you can drop into the interview.
- 2. Have clear examples of the projects you have worked on and what you actually did on those projects, be precise about your actual role.



You could even bring notes or a folder to refer to if you need to. This not only shows your preparation but it will also help to aide your memory if you are feeling nervous.

3. Prepare 3 questions.

Think about what you would like to ask about the role, the company or the culture. This is your chance face-to-face to find out if the company will actually fit with you and your needs.

Using these three top tips will give you the best chance of presenting yourself well at your next interview, help to relieve those unwanted nerves and get you the job!

What is your job title? Fire Engineering Technician
How long have you worked in this industry? Passive Fire

What drew you to fire engineering? It felt like the natural progression route for my career, and sense of achievement knowing what I am doing can potentially save lives.

What qualifications do you have? Lvl 3 Site Carpentry, FIRAS Technician

Where did you study? Tameside College, currently studying for the LVL 3 IFE PFP certificate

How do you explain your job in a nutshell? Review, advise, survey on fire safety elements within all types of buildings.

What company do you work for currently? OFR Consultants Ltd

What location is your office? Manchester, but we have offices all over the UK

How long have you been with this company? 5 months What do you like about working there? Atmosphere, progression, benefits, work-life balance

Only read what you need to for each project!

This is a great insight and it goes to show that opportunities are out there with many companies who are prepared to invest in people and skills, even if you don't think you are completely qualified, it is worth asking the question.
